
Membership

- The new Digital Membership Certificate was implemented from 2016 membership year with notable cost-saving



It continues to retain a place on the Department of Higher Education and Training List of Approved South African Journals.

LiT Magazine: The LIASA-in-Touch (LIT) magazine has continued its professional exposition of the activities of the Association, its members, partners, vendors, peers and, IFLA. The previous editor Ms Nohra Moerat, who resigned as a result of work and personal commitments, has been replaced by Mr Jeremiah Pietersen. They have been working together for the first 2017 issue of the LiT.
